



- Nora El Goulli is the Director of Team Strategy at groupH Ltd and "holds a Doctor of Pharmacy degree [Faculte de Pharmacie de Tours] and an MBA [Kellogg School of Management, Northwestern U, 1994]. She spent 10 years working on mass vaccination programs in 80 countries in Asia, Africa and Latin America and has always been passionate about improving access to healthcare in the third world. At Pasteur Vaccins, the vaccine arm of the Pasteur Insitute in Paris, she was responsible for the world's first viral Hepatitis B vaccine. Her role involved working with public health authorities to promote the use of the vaccine in their countries. The vaccine is now a standard component of the standard vaccination program across the third world. During a holiday visit to Roatan, she witnessed the devastating shortages of medicines at the public hospital. The hospital pharmacist had no purchasing budget and no access to suppliers. She was disempowered by the system and frustrated. Nora thought that it was feasible to sustainably improve the situation. She founded Medicines for Roatan in 2006." 


- **Béatrix (Peponnet-Morlot) Fougeron** sent us this update: "Après 2 ans à Singapour me voici maintenant en South Korea."



I had never been to Metz, although I know Nancy quite well. It's a strange city: Part ancient Gallo-Romain, part Gothic, part recognisably French and part recognisably German with a touch of garrison town to boot. The thing which was particularly interesting for me was that my Great Grandmother was born there and her entire family is buried there. She emigrated to London in about 1900, married, and had her children (including my Grandmother Elizabeth) here.

I went to the Hotel de Ville trying to find out about my family, whose name was Beckermann, but they said I needed to go to the *Archives Municipales* to find records going back far enough. Sadly I was only in Metz for two days, one of which was the concert itself, and had no time. A voir! Happy 2009 by the way!" 





J'ai moi-même été élève en maternelle avec Mlle Loret, puis en 11ème avec mlle Bazini, et pour finir en 10eme avec Mlle Dejean de 1964 à juin 1967.

En rentrant en France, nous nous sommes installés à Paris où j'ai fait toutes mes études. Sans être supersticieuse, il semblerait que le chiffre 8 me porte bonheur. En effet, j'ai eu mon bac en 1978 (eh oui, j'ai redoublé une classe), je me suis mariée en 1988, et notre première fille est arrivée en 1998.
