

A Florida jury said the use of "Laura Buccellati" as a trademark for the high-end bag company was likely to confuse consumers into believing the granddaugher's brand was somehow connected to the much-older Buccellati jewelry company. A judge later entered judgment against her and against Laura Buccellati LLC for infringement, unfair competition, false designation and false description of fact. The jurors refused, however, to find that the younger Buccellati's actions were willful, and they also cleared her of dilution and false advertising claims. Business partner Lillian Azel was cleared of all charges, and Buccellati jewelry was awarded no damages....."




