Amérique du Nord. Arrivé aux Etats-Unis à l'âge de huit ans, l'ancien banquier de Wall Street joue un rôle clé dans l'implantation du club à Brooklyn et rêve d'aider les Nets à atteindre les sommets de la meilleure ligue de basket-ball du monde. Dans l'organigramme des Brooklyn Nets, entre le propriétaire russe Mikhail Prokhorov d'un côté et les actionnaires minoritaires de l'autre, un nom à consonance française saute aux yeux : Christophe Charlier.
