In 2013, he founded Symbiotic Health to develop microbiome-based therapeutics to address critical public health challenges. • Emily (Allen) Hornblower (LSY: 10eme in 1986) shared this with us: "As of last summer, I started teaching in New Jersey prisons as part of the NJ Scholarship and Transformative Education in Prisons Consortium (http://njstep.newark.rutgers.edu/). It is "an association of higher education institutions in NJ that works in partnership with the New Jersey Department of Corrections and State Parole Board, to provide higher education courses for all students under the custody of the State of New Jersey while they are incarcerated, and assist in the transition to college life upon their release into the community....." I taught History 101 (Western Civilization) last summer, at the medium-security Northern State Prison in Newark. This was one of the most rewarding and enriching teaching experiences of my life. In 2016 I will be teaching at the maximum-security East Jersey State Prison in Rahway."






