• "Originally from Tuxedo Park, New York, Adrianna de Svastich began her ballet training under Leonid Kozlov in Ramsey, New Jersey. At 14, she was accepted at The School of American Ballet in New York City, where she trained from 1999-2004. She also attended various summer programs with American Ballet Theatre, Miami City Ballet, and The Royal Ballet School in London. While a student at The School of American Ballet, Ms. de Svastich performed in two annual workshop performances which included roles in George Balanchine's Chopiniana, Serenade, Le Tombeu de Couperin and Union Jack: Royal Navy, as well as Bournonville's Ballabile from Napoli. She also performed in George Balanchine's The Nutcracker at the Palace Theater in Stamford, Connecticut, for two years. While attending The School of American Ballet Student Choreography Workshop, Ms. de Svastich choreographed two original pieces, Street Scenes in Hong Kong and Salvador. During her final year at the school, she performed with the New York City Ballet in Balanchine's Serenade and Chopiniana, and in Susan Stroman's Double Feature.

Ms. de Svastich was a member of Pennsylvania Ballet II for two years before becoming an Apprentice in August 2007. She has been promoted to the Corps de Ballet for the 2009-2010 Season. Her performing experience with Pennsylvania Ballet includes George Balanchine's The Nutcracker, Ballo Della Regina, and Serenade; Christopher Wheeldon's Swan Lake; John Cranko's Romeo and Juliet; Matthew Neenan's Carmina Burana; Giselle; and The Sleeping Beauty. In addition to being a member of the Company, Ms. de Svastich is also pursuing a B.A. in History from the University of Pennsylvania." (.paballet.org)

They were always willing to go over new results or problems." Since graduating, Badaly has begun work as a research assistant in the Infant Action Lab at NYU. 




