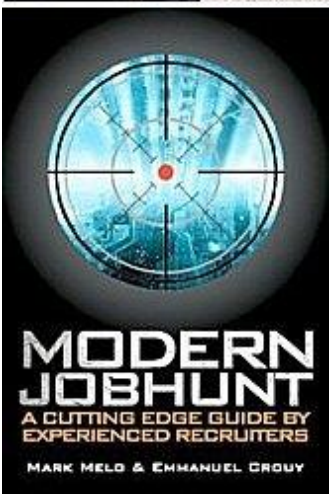

● **Céline Leboeuf** (*LSY: 8eme in 1995*) wrote: "I received my Ph.D. in Philosophy from Harvard University in May 2016, and I am now Assistant Professor of Philosophy at Florida International University in Miami. ● **Alfonso de Alba** (*LSY: Terminale in 2003*) told us that he is "currently posted in Rome as Chief Political Officer for the Mexican Embassy to Italy." **Editor's note:** Alfonso is a former Deputy Consul of Mexico in Tucson (Arizona), and the first Foreign Service Officer to ever win Mexico's National Public Administration Prize, the nation's highest award for public servants.

● **Emmanuel Crouy** (*LSY: Terminale in 2003*): "To cater to the demand for reliable and capable part-timers, Emmanuel Crouy, Mark Melo and Ke Liang co-founded [in early 2016] the review app GrabJobs.....A first in Singapore, GrabJobs' objective is to offer a rating and review system for each part-timer that completes a job with a designated employer. "One of the major pain points of the F&B industry in Singapore is finding reliable staff,' says Emmanuel Crouy [who] understands the predicament that the industry faces with regards to hiring part-timers. With this new app, every employer who engages a part-timer will review their performance once their assignment is completed. Job seekers can view available jobs in real time and filter them by type of industry, schedule, salary and location. Upon receiving applications for a job posted on the app, employers are able to filter out non-performing part-timers based on reviews and ratings, along with other filters.....To incentivize part-timers to perform better, GrabJobs offers cash bonuses when part-timers complete five jobs that are rated positively. This is a unique feature of GrabJobs, which similar apps in the market currently do not offer....."

● **Jeremy Suyker** (*LSY: 4eme in 1999*) "is a French documentary photographer and reporter specialized in socio-cultural and contemporary issues." In May, 2016, *Roads & Kingdoms* (an independent journal of food, politics, travel and culture) published a fascinating photo essay he wrote about Chinese tourism in Europe. In the introduction, Jeremy wrote:

"In 2015, Chinese tourists made 120 million trips abroad—a figure that has more than doubled in the last five years.....Europe is their number one Western destination, thanks to its heritage and shopping opportunities. More than a tourist holiday, a trip to the Old Continent is a symbol of social achievement. It's a trophy to bring home on a memory card—or in the form of the latest Louis Vuitton suitcase. Chinese travel agencies plan every element of the tours for a clientele made up mostly of first-time international travelers who want to visit as many countries as possible in a limited amount of time. Last April, I joined a group on a 10-day journey to the UK, France, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Austria, and Italy. What started as journalistic curiosity rapidly evolved into a photographic statement against the abuses of a system that promotes consumption at the expense of meaningful human experiences. As one traveler told me: 'When we will be asked what we remember of Europe, we will answer: nothing.' "
