The first is our project WOMENABILITY which aims at comparing women's experience in cities, sharing best practices and creating the first worldwide guidelines for gender equitable and safe cities. Our process: travel to 30 cities and empower women and men to conduct "exploratory walks", create an easy-to-use digital platform to promote best practices and organize an international forum in Paris with women mayors to create gender equitable guidelines. For this project, we need connections in the 30 cities and funds. The second is One, Two, Three... RAP!, a cultural organization that provides academic support with an objective to motivate young French people to learn English through American Hip Hop music and culture. For this project, we need connections in NYC or South Africa as we wish to travel with 20 under privileged youth to one of those destination. We also need volunteers who speak English here in Paris. 





