The Lycée was the best education a kid could have. It really prepares you for life. Learning to argue both sides of a topic that you might feel bias about is a great asset when going into the workforce. After university I did a little stint in fashion working at Bergdorf Goodman then found myself in the restaurant industry, at DANIEL, one of the top restaurants in the world. I loved the discipline, precision, and professionalism. It reminded me of the Lycée in some sort. After one year I was hooked and moved to San Francisco where I worked for a two star Michelin restaurant, Coi. The restaurant was very different from DANIEL. Coi was a small intimate cove with a core staff of 5 people. We carried a family owned Chinese tea producer that was phenomenal: Red Blossom. This was my first introduction to traditional Chinese tea that we served in gaiwans -- Chinese lidded bowls used for the infusion of tea leaves and the consumption of tea.

I started drinking more tea and less coffee. I discovered a tea bar on Valencia Street (Samovar) that served homemade chai. Once I had their chai I was obsessed. I have had chai in the past but never this good. I loved the concept and the aesthetic so much that when I returned to New York for an ACL surgery, I knew that I had to bring a piece of Samovar to NY. 
